Learn the Books of the Bible

Have you ever participated in a Sword Drill at Camp Li-Lo-Li? Do you ever wonder how some people can find the verses so fast? Using the Table of Contents is a great start, but memorizing the books of the Bible in order can help you find verses you need much faster. A lot of people use songs to help them remember the books of the Bible. You can use any of the songs below or one you already know to help you learn all the books in a row. Memorize the books of the Bible and make a video of yourself saying or singing them all in order OR say/sing all 66 books to an adult and have them type their name in the response box. You must get through all 66 books with 2 “helps” or less. **Upload your video for us to see OR have the adult type their name in the response box.**

Phases of the Moon





Campfire Eclairs

By now you've probably made a s'more on a campfire and maybe even a cinnamon roll too. But have you ever made a campfire eclair? With a crunchy, buttery outside and a melty whip cream inside, these are a great summer treat! For this challenge, we want you to make these campfire eclairs around a campfire with your family or friends.

Bubble Art

Abstract art is modern art which does not look like something we see in our everyday world. It has color, lines and shapes (form), but they are not intended to represent objects or living things. For this challenge, we want you to make your own abstract bubble art using a few household supplies. When you're done, **upload a picture of your work(s) of art for us to see!**

Campfire Eclaires

Ingredients

- 3/4 or 1 inch wood dowels from the hardware store or a stick of about the same width
- Non-stick aluminum foil (or foil and non-stick cooking spray)
- 1 tube refrigerated crescent roll dough
- 1 can spray whipped cream

Directions (For directions with pictures, check out the one on the [Robin Badge Page](#))

1. Tightly wrap the end of your wood dowel with non-stick foil OR wrap with foil sprayed with non-stick cooking spray.
2. Using one crescent roll triangle*, wrap the dough around the top and sides of the dowel, making sure it's not too thick and doesn't have any gaps or holes. The goal is to make a tall, narrow "cup" of dough after it is cooked.
3. Hold it over the coals or above the flames (not in the flames), rotating until it is golden brown (not doughy) on all sides. Be patient- this takes some time.
4. When your dough is golden brown on all sides, let it cool slightly. When cool enough to touch, gently slide the eclair shell off the end of the stick.
5. Once your shell has cooled a little more, fill it with whipped cream and enjoy!

Chocolate Butterscotch Haystacks

Ingredients

- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 package (10 to 11 ounces) butterscotch chips
- 4 cups crispy chow mein noodles

Directions

1. In a microwave or large metal bowl over simmering water, melt chocolate chips and butterscotch chips; stir until smooth. Gently stir in noodles.
2. Drop by rounded tablespoonfuls onto waxed paper-lined baking sheets. Refrigerate 10-15 minutes or until set.

Knot Your Average Game

Before you start, make sure everyone playing knows how to tie the following knots:

- Figure 8 Knot
- Half Hitch
- Half Knot
- Noose Knot
- Overhand Knot
- Sheet Bend
- Slip Knot
- Square Knot

Objective: To win the most rounds by the end of the game. You win a round by being the first person to correctly tie a specific knot.

Materials Needed:

- a piece of rope or string for each player
- [knot cards](#) (optional) (page 11)
- Pen & paper to keep score (if not using knot cards)

Playing the game:

With cards: To setup, print and cut out the cards on page 11. Shuffle the cards and place them facedown. For the first round, the oldest player turns over the top card for all players to see. As soon as the card is turned over, all players will start tying the knot indicated on the face-up card. The first person to successfully tie the knot wins that round and keeps that card. Repeat this process with the person flipping the top card going clockwise through the group. Once all 8 cards are gone, the person with the most cards wins.

Without cards: For this variation, you will need 1 person who is not competing to tie the knots, called the *gamekeeper*. The gamekeeper is in charge of picking the knot for each round and keeping score for all players. Have a list of the 8 basic knots. Each round, the gamekeeper will pick a knot from the list and announce it to the group. As soon as the knot is announced, all players will start tying the knot announced. The first person to successfully tie the knot wins that round and earns one point. Once you have gone through all 8 knots, the person with the most points wins.

In the event of a knot-tying tie: Pick another card from the deck/list and have the players who tied compete to see who can tie the new knot fastest. The winner keeps the original card (or gets 1 point) and the tie-breaker knot goes back in the deck (or does not get crossed off the list if playing without cards).

Variations:

This game can be played with any set of knots. Feel free to explore <https://www.animatedknots.com/> and add as many knots as you'd like to the list! Use the boxes on page 12 to make your own set of knot cards to add to the basic knots! Or if you're playing without cards, add as many knots as you'd like to the list!

Make Your Own Cards

Bubble Art Instructions

1. In a cup or small bowl, mix a squirt of craft paint and a squirt of dish soap
2. Add a few tablespoons of water and mix the solution thoroughly
3. Blow bubbles into your soapy mixture until they just overflow the top of your container
4. Place your paper on top of the container to pop the bubbles and release the paint
5. Repeat steps 3-4 until your paper is covered in your bubble design!

Notes:

- A thick paper, like card stock or watercolor paper works best, since it won't curl up when it gets wet
- You may have to experiment with the correct paint-to-water ratio to get the bubbles to show up well on your paper
- Try a few different colors to make beautiful designs
